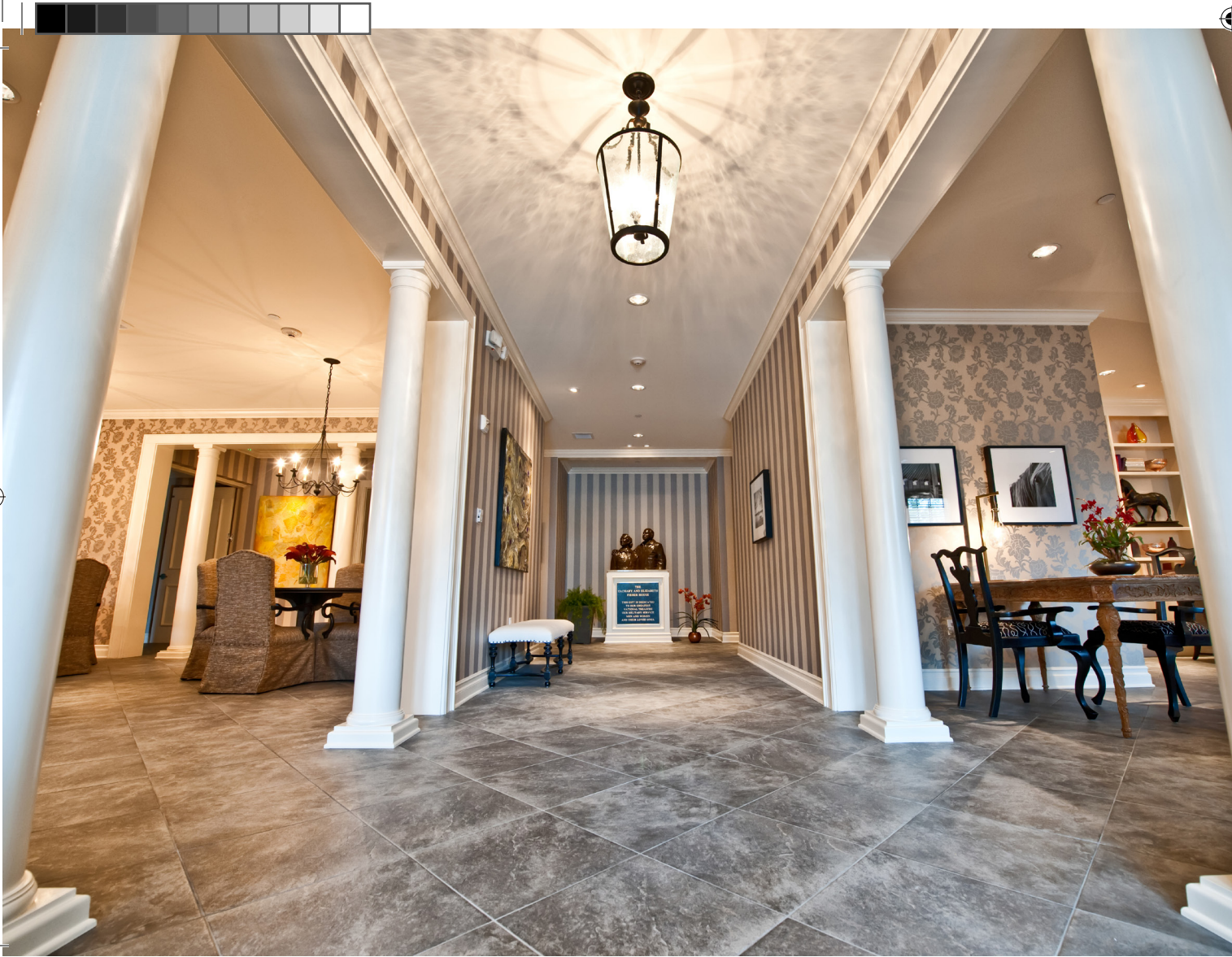

Donn Weinberg

Chairman & Executive V.P., Harry & Jeanette Weinberg Foundation

Donn Weinberg is Chairman and Executive Vice President of the Harry & Jeanette Weinberg Foundation, a \$2 billion private charitable foundation based in Baltimore, Maryland, and Honolulu, Hawaii. The Weinberg Foundation's mission is to fund nonprofits that provide direct services to economically disadvantaged people, primarily in the U.S., Israel, and the former Soviet Union. Donn has been employed full-time by the Foundation since 1993, and also has been a trustee of the Foundation since 2002. He became Chairman in February of 2010. His day-to-day responsibilities include managing the Foundation's non-Hawaiian real estate portfolio (much of which is in the Baltimore region), acting as the Baltimore office's primary liaison to the Hawaii office, supervising various grant initiatives, and serving as the Foundation's in-house attorney.

Before joining the Foundation, Donn was a trial lawyer in Maryland for 15 years. In college he had a double major in philosophy and communications, and in law school he served as editor-in-chief of Law Review. He serves actively on the boards of the Philanthropy Roundtable (for which he also is Treasurer) and the Jewish Funders Network (for which he also serves on its Executive Committee and Chair of its Strategic Planning Committee). Donn frequently has served as a speaker about philanthropy-related public policy issues and the Weinberg Foundation's role in dealing with those issues. Since September 2007, as a hobby, Mr. Weinberg has been a volunteer singer-entertainer at older adult residential and day facilities in the Baltimore area and also for some non-profit fundraisers in New York City.



An Open Door to a Home Away From Home ...

Service members, veterans and their families are located worldwide, often traveling great distances for specialized medical care. The opening of the Fisher House at Fort Belvoir offers them an open door to a home away from home while receiving care at Fort Belvoir Community Hospital.

Fisher House Foundation donates and builds “comfort homes” on the grounds of major military bases and VA medical centers. The homes enable family members to be near loved ones during hospitalization due to illness, or injury. The program recognizes the significant contributions and sacrifices of our men and women in uniform, and demonstrates the nation’s admiration and willingness to support them and their families, particularly in their time of need. The Fisher House program was established in 1990 by Zachary and Elizabeth Fisher.

Today, Zachary’s grandnephew, Ken Fisher, Chairman and CEO, Fisher House Foundation, continues the family legacy of reuniting military service personnel and veterans with their families during medical recovery. Under his leadership, the program has expanded from 24 to 57 houses, and continues to grow.

“We have a mission that we have committed ourselves to, and that is to support our troops,” said Ken Fisher. “They deserve the best we have, and we’ll be there as long as we’re needed.”

The Fisher House at Fort Belvoir is a 10,000 square foot home with 12 private guest suites. The common areas and guest suites are professionally designed and beautifully furnished. The Fisher House includes various common areas including a kitchen and spacious dining room, a family and living room, and a large laundry facility with multiple washers and dryers. Most importantly, the Fisher House will have staff and volunteers to support our active service members, Veterans and their families.

Colonel Annicelli, a native of Newton, Mass., holds a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from the University of Massachusetts, North Dartmouth, a Master of Science in Nursing from the University of Texas Health Science Center, San Antonio as a Clinical Nurse Specialist (Critical Care Nursing), and an M.S.N. from State University of New York (SUNY) at Buffalo as a Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist. Annicelli also graduated from the U.S. Army War College, Carlisle, Pa., earning a Masters in Strategic Studies in 2002.

Colonel Annicelli's command assignments include service as the Chief, Clinical Nursing at Landstuhl Regional Medical Center (LRMC), Germany, where she held dual positions as the Deputy Commander for Nursing and the Chief Nurse of the Europe Regional Medical Command. She also served as Commander of Raymond W. Bliss Army Health Center, Fort Huachuca, Ariz., followed by dual positions as Deputy Commander for Nursing and Health Services, Walter Reed Army Medical Center, Washington D.C., and Chief Nurse Executive, North Atlantic Regional Medical Command. Annicelli then served as the Chief, Warrior Transition Division, Joint Task Force National Capital Region Medical in Bethesda, Md. She most recently served as the commander of the DeWitt Health Care Network.

Colonel Annicelli held several clinical positions at Fort Sam Houston, Texas; Fort Bragg, N.C., Fort Belvoir, Va.; the 18th Field Hospital, Joint Task Force – Bravo (Honduras); National AMEDD Augmentation Detachment, Fort Gillem, Ga.; 307th Medical Battalion (82nd Airborne), 274th FST (44th Medical Brigade) and Walter Reed Army Medical Center.
